COLOR AND BIOETHICS

Henk ten Have (Board member of the St. André International Center) recently published a new book with the surprising title Color, Healthcare and Bioethics. The electronic version is available free-of-charge at: https://www.openbookpublishers.com/books/10.11647/obp.0443



Traditionally regarded as secondary to objective medical observations or rational ethical debates, color has been marginalized in these fields, considered subjective and inconsequential. However, this book reveals that color is critical in diagnostic and therapeutic practices and that it subconsciously influences moral interpretations in bioethics. From 'feeling blue' to seeing the world in 'black and white', color conveys complex messages that inform our perceptions of health, morality, and identity.

2025 SEMINAR ON THE ETHICS OF END-OF-LIFE CARE (ROME, ITALY)

In February of 2025, the Saint André International Center organized its second offering of the intensive seminar on the Ethics of End-of-Life Care: Contributions from the Arts and Humanities. Health care practitioners, ethicists, lawyers, social scientists and still other professionals, as well as one graduate student, participated, as did invited speakers Alberto Gomez, Therese Lysaught, Joseph Tham and Henk ten Have. It was our most international seminar yet with representation from Canada, China, France, Israel, Italy, Malaysia, Netherlands, Norway, Spain and the USA

STUDY-ABROAD BIOETHICS SEMINAR

In March of 2025, the Chateau Saint André Center organized its first study-abroad bioethics seminar. Fourteen students, accompanied by four professors from Snow College in Utah, USA, traveled to Rome. During their 8 days in Italy, they attended part of the annual conference of the Pontifical Academy for Life, engaged with international bioethics experts, explored relevant cultural sites in the city of Rome and Castelgandolfo, and reflected on all of the insights gained during their stay at the stunningly beautiful Villa Palazzola on Lake Albano.

Back home, they presented their findings at the annual conference of the Utah Academy of Science, Arts, and Letters. They all received lots of kudos and the poster from Miranda Slusser and Savanna Thompson entitled "Body Worlds: Issues of Corpses & Human Dignity, Insights from Rome," was selected as the top poster at the conference. The seminar was co-directed by Jos Welie (President of the St. André Center) and Greg Wright (Snow professor and 2023 participant in the Ethics Educators Workshop), assisted therein by Sander Welie (health lawyer and psychologist from The Netherlands).
